We had so much fun, we lost track of time and didn't manage to get them finished.

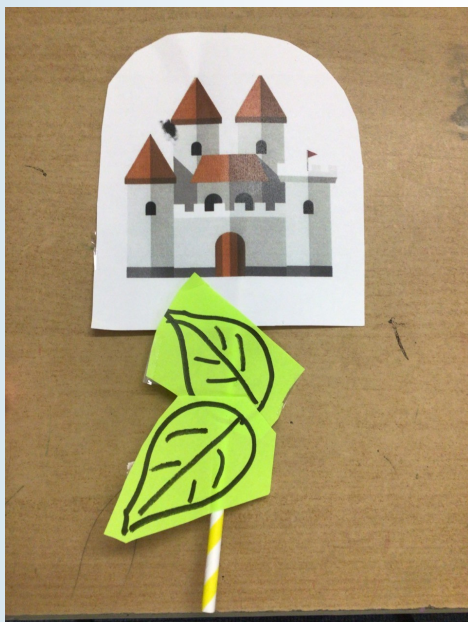


# EYFS

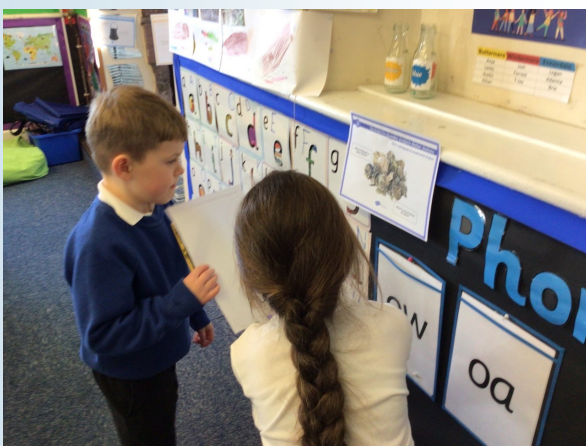
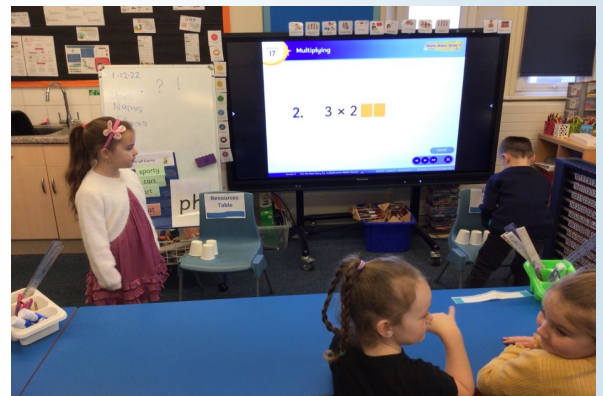
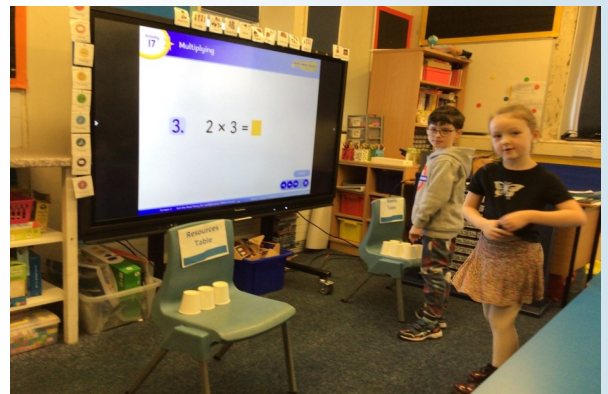
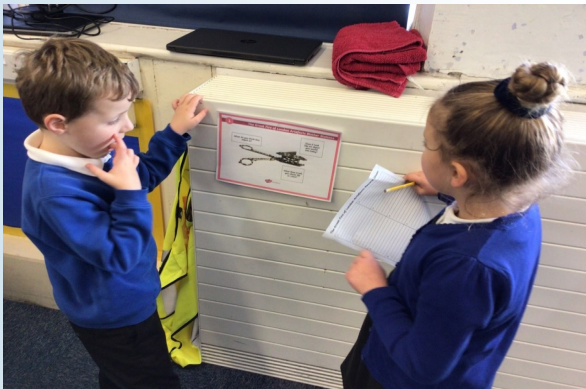
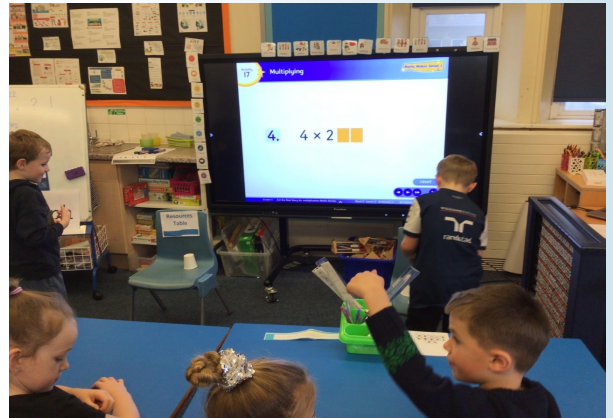
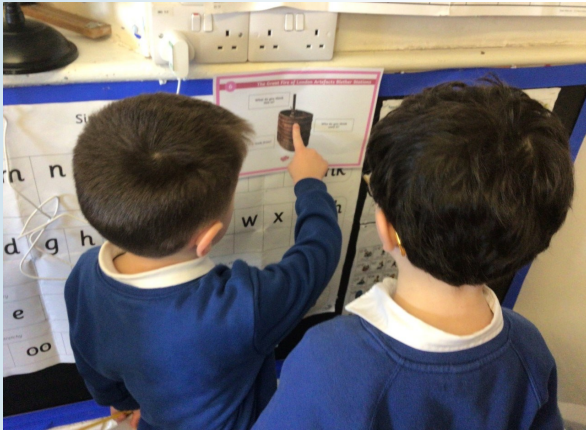
The children have also planted their own beans, but they know that it will take a little longer than overnight for them to produce a beanstalk.
