





EYFS

Cost of Living

Support for Families with Young Children



Are you a family with young children requiring a little extra support during the current cost of living crisis?

Child Benefit

Child benefit is a paid allowance that can help you with the costs of your children. It's usually paid every 4 weeks. If you've just had a baby, you need to register the birth before you claim.

Claim Child Benefit

Sure Start Maternity Grant

A one-off payment of $\pounds 500$ to help towards the costs of having a child. You qualify for the grant if:

- · You're expecting your first child,
- · You or your partner already get certain benefits

Healthy Start

If you're more than 10 weeks pregnant or have a child under 4, the Healthy Start scheme can help you:

- Buy healthy foods like milk or fruit
- Get free vitamins

Food Banks

Struggling to feed yourself or your family there are organisations that can help. Foodbanks can provide emergency food parcels in a crisis:

Food banks in Cumbria

Baby Banks

Like a food bank but for baby essentials. Baby Banks collect items for new-borns to 5 year olds from the local community and give them to families who are in urgent need of help.

UK Baby Banks

Cash For Kids Grants

To provide emergency essentials that support the physical and mental well-being of children who are struggling.
