

Please also use the junior entrance door for breakfast and after school clubs.


The door bell for WRAP will be put outside of the school office with the other bells.






It has been lovely to have everyone back in school and that we have been able to enjoy the sunshine outdoors.

As the building work outdoors has now finished we were able to put all of the outdoor toys back out. The children used a map of our outdoors area and decided where to put all the resources. They then followed the map and made the outside space an excellent place to learn and have fun. We have started our new topic 'Minibeast'. The children first sorted minibeasts from a animals and then we decided which minibeasts we liked (green on our graph) and which ones we didn't (red on the graph). As you can see spiders are quite popular which really surprised us. As we continue our topic we are hoping to get some live butterfly eggs and watch them evolve from egg, to caterpillar, to cocoon (chrysalis), to butterfly. The children today created a picture of the life cycle of the butterfly using information from the book The Very Hungry Caterpillar.
