## **EYFS**

This week has been filled with snails as we continued our mini east topic. We read a book all about snails then went on hunt to see if we could find any in the field. In our book we found out that snails like to eat grotty brown leaves but they will also nibble on green leaves. They like stones and wood to climb over so before we collected the snails we make sure they had a suitable home. We didn't expect to find many but ended up with a large variety. We first had them in our little pots so we could observe them closely but then we put them in a large container so we could watch them climbing. We also placed them on coloured paper to look at the trail they left behind. They were much speedier than we expected so we beamed one Turbo and one Speedy. The children have labelled diagrams and are able to recall a lot of information about snails. They have spent each day collecting and observing and pointing out the facts coming to life before them. We have also continued to observe the growth of the caterpillars. We are sure they are nearing the next stage of their life cycle and they will soon form the cocoons/ chrysalis.
